RECEIVING THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM this morning is **Charlotte Anne "Charlie" Walter,** daughter of Joe and Erin Walter and granddaughter of Frank and the Rev.

Margo Walter. Presenting Charlotte to baptized on behalf of her PCUM family is Elder Laura Phillips. Representing Charlotte's church family and the circle of loved ones celebrating her life and God's love for her in Christ are her aunt, Elizabeth Suarez, and her uncle, Sam Walter.

BAPTISM IN THE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH (U.S.A.) celebrates the truth that God's love claims us even before we are able to respond in faith. In the PC (USA), baptism itself does not bring about salvation, but is an outward sign pointing to God's loving and free gift to us of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The waters of baptism represent the washing away of all brokenness that separates us from God, our dying and rising with Christ, and an adoption into the covenant family of Christ's Body, the church. The entire congregation, on behalf of the worldwide Christian church, assumes responsibility for nurturing the baptized children in the Christian life. *"KICK-OFF SUNDAY"* is NEXT SUNDAY – Next Sunday, September 19th, PCUM's 2021-2022 Sunday School program year begins with a celebratory gathering of children K-7th grade and teachers following Children's Time during the 10:00 am Sunday morning service. Then, after the service, all worshipers are warmly invited to connect with old and new friends on the church's East Lawn for *"Kick-Off Sunday"* music, children's games (including the annual favorite, the dunk tank!), and safely-packaged snacks.

CATCH UP OR PAY AHEAD ON YOUR PLEDGE – As we come out of summer and enter into fall, your financial commitment to PCUM's ministry will go a long way toward helping your congregation's ministry navigate these challenging times. PCUM's COVID GUIDELINES: With the maximum number of PCUM worshipers' health and well-being in mind, the Session has adopted a comprehensive, cautious set of protocols to govern this transition. After this initial period, if infection rates keep dropping and vaccination rates continue to rise, the Session will move to ease restrictions further. For this first phase back, here are several of the most important protocols/restrictions to keep in mind:

* **Registration** (online and in-person) **and check-in will be required**. Those registering will be asked to provide the names of each person who will be worshiping as part of their group. Registration links can be found on the church website at <u>www.pcum.org</u> or in church emails.

* **All worshipers**, either individuals or groups (families), **will sit in assigned, safely-distanced seats**. Ushers will guide you to your assigned seats. Please follow ushers' instructions at all times. * The **maximum number of persons** allowed in the sanctuary at one time will be **160**. Movement within the sanctuary will be limited. **Worship leaders are fully vaccinated** and will be distanced from worshipers. * **Masks will be required for all worshipers** (who are not leading worship) whether speaking or singing, at all times while in the building. This is the start of a new phase in our community's recovery to "normal," and each of us has their own level of comfort as to how quickly we get there. Again, it is the first step, one we're all taking together. In order to maximize the number of PCUM worshipers who will feel welcome in this initial phase, PCUM's leaders have chosen to err on the side of caution by requiring masks at this time. In addition, all or most children and younger teens in our church family have not yet been vaccinated. Thank you for respecting and adhering to this requirement.

* Worshipers are respectfully asked and strongly encouraged to ARRIVE EARLY (at least 10 minutes early) during this initial transition phase. This will allow time for you and other worshipers to be checked-in and seated--and allow the service to start on time. Late-comers will be seated only at a specific, pre-determined moment, well after the service has started.

* A Sunday offering will be received at the conclusion of each service, as worshipers exit the sanctuary. Offering plates will be stationed near the entrance to the sanctuary so that worshipers may make their offerings as they arrive or depart.

* On the first Sunday of each month the **Sacrament of the Lord's Supper** (Communion) is celebrated using **pre-made**, **sealed Communion elements**, distributed to all worshipers as they arrive.

* Worship services will continue to be live-streamed on PCUM's YouTube channel.
