BAPTISM IN THE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH (U.S.A.) celebrates the truth that God's love claims us even before we are able to respond in faith. In the PC (USA), baptism itself does not bring about salvation, but is an outward sign pointing to God's love for us and free gift to us of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The waters of baptism represent the washing away of all brokenness that separates us from God, our dying and rising with Christ, and an adoption into the covenant family of Christ's Body, the church. The entire congregation, on behalf of the worldwide Christian church, assumes responsibility for nurturing the baptized children in the Christian life.

PCUM's associate pastor from 2012 to 2017. Lauren is currently serving with the Presbyterian Church of East Africa (PCEA) in Kenya, where she lives with her husband, Dan Nduati, and daughter, Kris. Since leaving PCUM, Lauren has served as lecturer at the Presbyterian University of East Africa and has been particularly involved in outreach to pastoralist communities--providing mentorship, administrative leadership, and program development for ministries with vulnerable Kenyan women and girls. In early 2019, Lauren accepted the PCEA's invitation to become their new Deputy Director of Mission for the denomination. Lauren is in the United States visiting her family and thanking the churches and individuals, including PCUM, who support her ministry in Kenya. Welcome back, Lauren!
